 - + don't have to be signed or sealed
- multiple copies of up-to-date resume
- multiple copies of SAT/ACT score reports

- official transcripts
 - + these should be sealed
 - + only given to schools as a way to expedite application review
- personal statements or essays

JUNIORS:

NEEDED ITEMS

- a few copies of their unofficial transcript
 - + these should include their first semester grades from junior year
- a few copies of their ACT/SAT score reports
